Another Year Defined by Resilience

As I reflect on 2025, I am moved by the extraordinary resilience we witnessed in communities from Gaza to Pakistan, from Sudan to Bangladesh. The world experienced some of its most severe humanitarian challenges in recorded history, and through it all, Human Concern International stood firm, delivering life-saving aid and long-term hope to those who needed it most.

This year, we reached **1,267,655** people through **22** emergency projects across **8** countries. These are not just numbers. Each figure represents a family that survived, a child who went to school, a mother who gave birth safely, a refugee who found warmth in the coldest months of winter.

Behind every program we ran in 2025 were real people whose stories I carry with me. Mariam, a mother displaced in Sudan with her six children, worried every day about keeping her family clean, healthy, and safe. Your generosity ensured hygiene packages reached her family, restoring not just their health but their dignity and their hope. And Zeina, a ten-year-old orphan in Gaza who misses her father every single day. She remembers the moments they spent drawing together. While nothing replaces a parent's love, your sponsorship means Zeina knows she is not forgotten. It gives her comfort, care, and the space to dream of a brighter future. These are not stories. These are lives transformed by your compassion.

We adapted. We innovated. We refused to abandon the principles of dignity, equity, and protection, even when the operating environment made that extraordinarily difficult.

None of this would be possible without you. On behalf of the communities we serve and the HCI family worldwide, I extend my deepest gratitude. You are the reason lives are saved.

We enter 2026 with clear eyes about the scale of the need ahead, and with unshakeable resolve to meet it.

Human Concern International operates at the intersection of emergency response and long-term development. We begin every intervention the same way: by listening. We engage directly with communities, conduct detailed needs assessments, and analyze local conditions before we act. This is what separates a program that endures from one that disappears.



VISION MISSION

Our Mission

For more than four decades, our leaders, team members, volunteers, and supporters have united under a common goal to create a world free of poverty and injustice. This is no small feat, yet, as stewards of God's creation, we must strive for nothing less. Whether responding to emergencies or assessing global needs, we are on a mission to transition families from crisis to self-sufficiency. Our aim isn't to foster dependence on aid, but to empower communities to thrive independently.

Our Vision

Our vision is to create a world free of poverty and injustice, where every individual can thrive independently and with dignity. We aspire to build a more just and equitable global community by transitioning families from crisis to self-sufficiency. Through inclusive and empowering initiatives, we aim to eliminate dependence on aid and foster a future where prosperity and hope abound for all.



OUR CORE PROGRAM PILLARS

1. Emergency Response

Emergency Response is HCI's frontline response to deliver life-saving assistance during a crisis. When floods, earthquakes, conflicts or other emergencies strike, HCI rapidly mobilizes to provide essential support, including food assistance, emergency shelter, clean water, hygiene supplies, and protection services. By prioritizing the most vulnerable families, HCI helps save lives, alleviate suffering, and support affected communities in their immediate recovery.



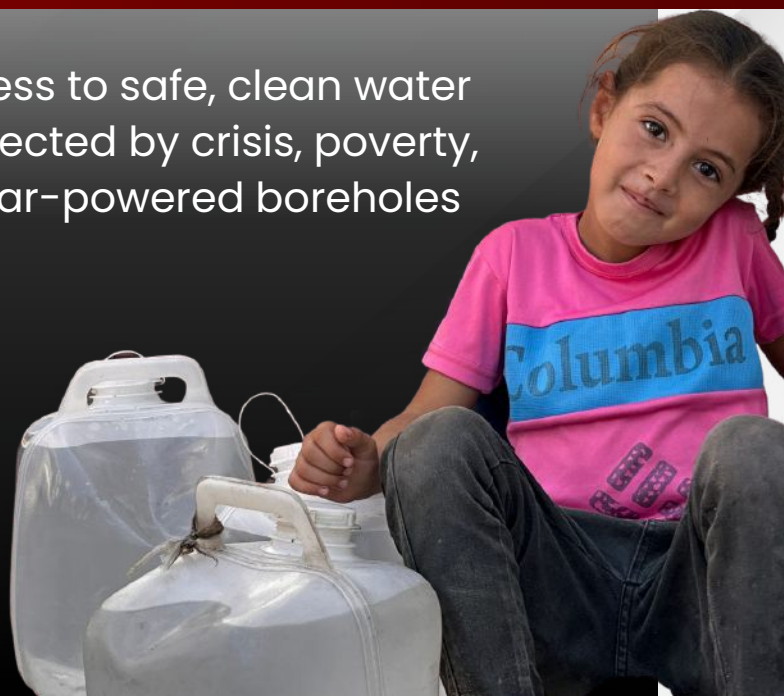
2. Zero Hunger and Food Security

HCI's Zero Hunger program addresses both immediate and chronic food insecurity through a range of culturally sensitive, community-driven food assistance programs. From Ramadan food packages to year-round bakery projects and Qurbani distributions, the program ensures that no family goes without food.



3. WASH: Water, Sanitation and Hygiene

HCI's WASH program expands access to safe, clean water and sanitation for communities affected by crisis, poverty, and geographic isolation. From solar-powered boreholes in rural schools to desalination plant rehabilitation in Gaza, the program targets both emergency need and long-term infrastructure.



4. Child Sponsorship Program

The Child Sponsorship Program provides holistic, sustained support to orphaned and vulnerable children (and their families) in crisis-affected and marginalized communities. It goes beyond financial assistance to address education, health, psychosocial wellbeing, and family resilience.



5. Education

HCI's Education program removes barriers to learning for children and youth in fragile and underserved contexts. Through scholarships, school construction, teacher training, and inclusive education for students with disabilities, HCI ensures that displacement, poverty, and conflict are not the end of a child's educational journey.



6. Health

HCI's Health program delivers essential medical care to populations living in collapsed or overwhelmed health systems. From maternity field hospitals in Gaza to home care for the elderly in Bosnia, the program covers the full spectrum of health needs.

7. Livelihoods and Sustainability

HCI's Livelihoods program strengthens long-term economic resilience by creating opportunities for individuals and communities to earn, learn, and thrive. Through employment initiatives, vocational training, education facilities, safe water systems, and stable housing, we help families build sustainable livelihoods, reduce dependency, and move towards lasting self-reliance.



8. Programming At Home

HCI's Canadian programs support vulnerable communities across the country by addressing both immediate humanitarian needs and long-term integration challenges faced by refugees, newcomers, homeless individuals, and food-insecure families. Through initiatives such as food bank in Ottawa services for struggling households and dedicated employment and housing support for Gaza newcomers rebuilding their lives in Canada, HCI works to strengthen dignity, stability, and community belonging. The program also includes seasonal relief efforts, mental health and social support services, women's leadership initiatives, and scholarships for marginalized students, as well as support for women's shelters, people with disabilities, and children with special needs, helping individuals and families move from crisis toward long-term resilience.





OUR ACCOUNTABILITY COMMITMENT

Every project at HCI is subject to continuous monitoring, detailed financial reporting, and outcome-based evaluation. We maintain close coordination with field teams and implementing partners to ensure resources are used responsibly.

This commitment to transparency and accountability, as per the core values on our strategic plan, strengthens trust with donors, partners, and the communities we serve, ensuring that every contribution delivers meaningful, measurable results.



MEET OUR AMBASSADORS

Ambassadors for Change

Our ambassadors are influencers, community leaders, and changemakers who help mobilize thousands in support of HCI's humanitarian mission. During these visits, ambassadors toured displacement shelters, visited hospitals and community centers, distributed aid directly to families, and spent meaningful time with orphaned children in HCI-supported programs. They participated in home renovation projects, met medical students in Gaza during the ceasefire, and witnessed the full spectrum of HCI's work from emergency food distributions to long-term livelihood development.

Their influence has mobilized thousands to support vital initiatives, from orphan sponsorships to emergency relief and sustainable development. Their dedication embodies the spirit of Ihsan, inspiring others to give, uplift, and make a lasting difference worldwide.

MP Delegation Visit to Bangladesh – November 2025

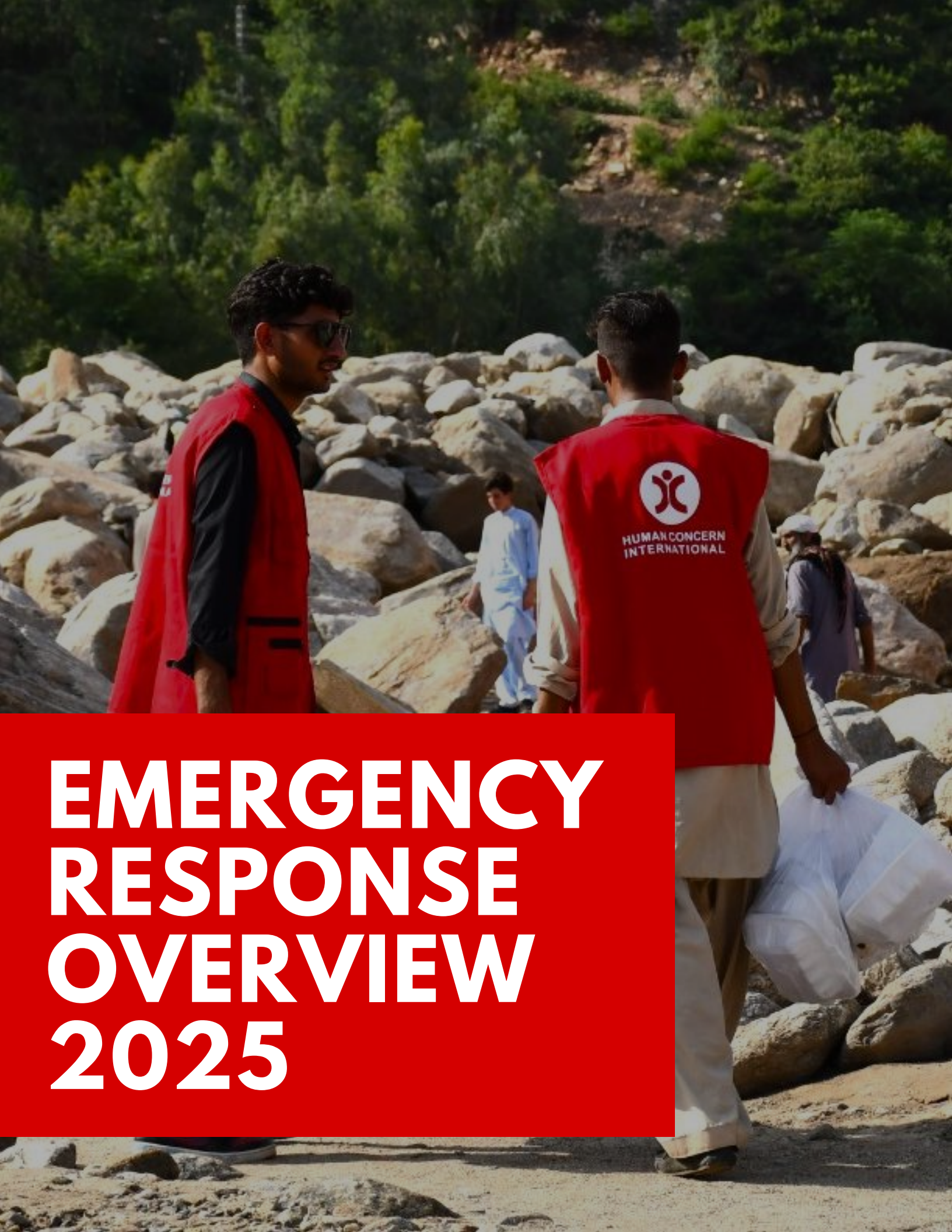

These conversations reinforced the importance of Canada's continued commitment to humanitarian assistance and international development efforts in Bangladesh.

TRAVEL WITH PURPOSE

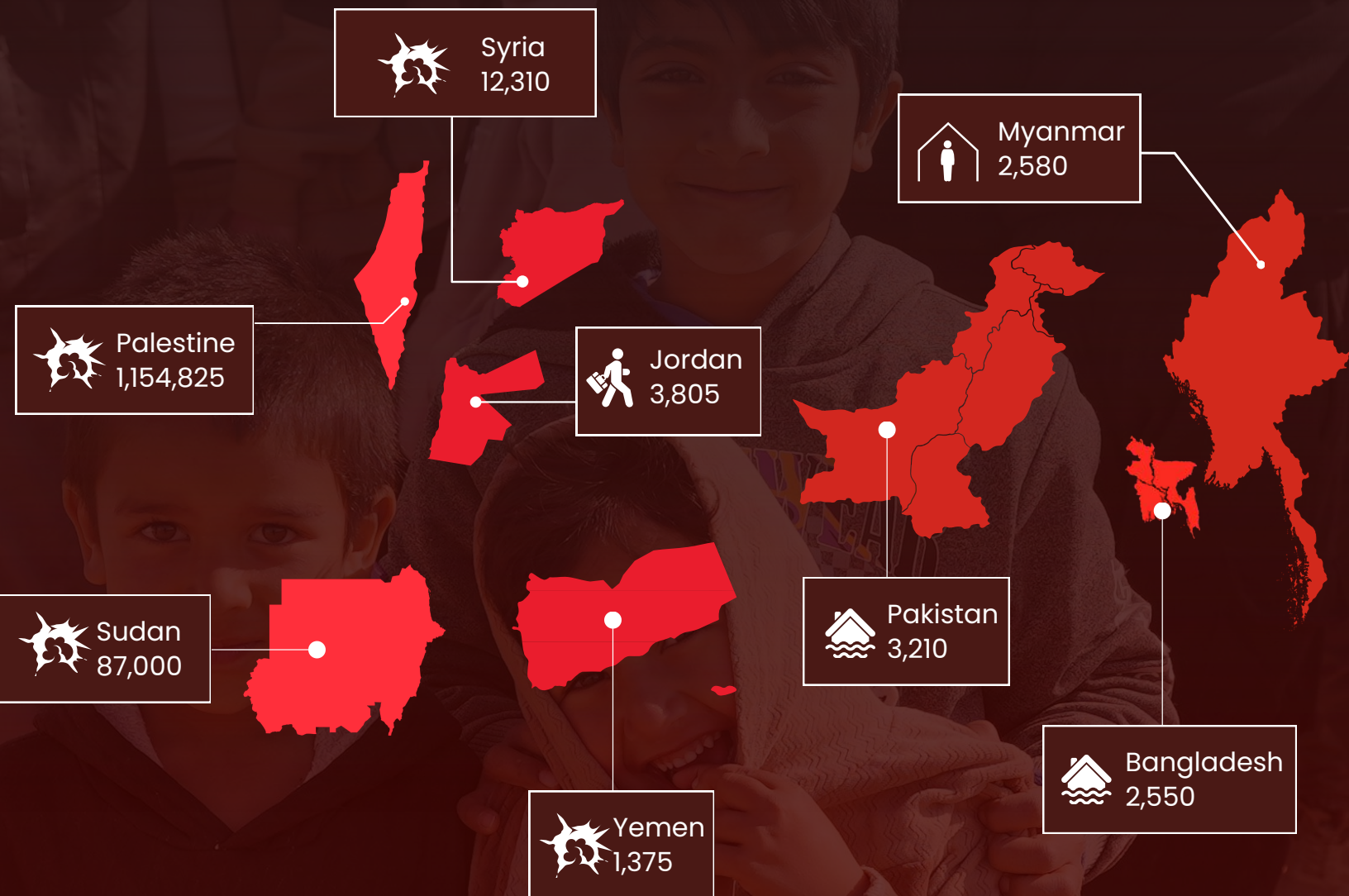

WHEN FAMILIES CANNOT WAIT

Emergency Relief at HCI is a year-round, frontline response addressing immediate risks to life and dignity caused by conflict, disasters, and displacement. We define an emergency as any rapid-onset or intensifying crisis that overwhelms local capacity to respond and places lives at immediate risk.

SUCCESS STORY:

Walaa's Family in Jordan

From Survival to Stability

There are kinds of weight that do not show on a person's face until you look closely. Walaa carries all of them.

A Palestinian refugee living in Al-Wahdat Camp in Jordan, Walaa was carrying everything alone. Four children. A husband hospitalized for psychiatric care. A child with cerebral palsy who needed physiotherapy she could barely afford to reach. A monthly income of less than 100 JOD. And a home that had stopped feeling like one long ago.

When HCI identified Walaa's household as a very high-vulnerability family requiring integrated support, the intervention was not a single box of aid and a signature. **It was a deliberate, structured response to the full picture of what this family needed.**

HCI provided one full year of rental assistance, removing the threat of eviction that had hung over the family and freeing Walaa from the particular terror of not knowing where her children would sleep. Essential furniture, household appliances, & house renovation were provided, restoring not just physical comfort but something harder to quantify: the dignity of a home that functions. For the child with cerebral palsy, a proper space to rest, recover, and move through daily life was no longer a wish. It was a reality.

The impact of this support cannot be measured only in rent receipts or furniture inventories. It is measured in a mother who can now accompany her disabled child to physiotherapy without calculating whether she can afford to leave the house. It is measured in children who fall asleep in stability rather than anxiety. It is measured in the hours Walaa no longer spends in crisis management, and the hours she can now spend simply being present for the people who need her most.





GAZA RESPONSE 2025

UPHOLDING DIGNITY IN GAZA

In 2025, Gaza remained one of the most catastrophic humanitarian crises in the world. The collapse of the ceasefire in early March led to renewed hostilities, mass displacement, and severe access restrictions. Over 473 million children globally live in conflict zones, and Gaza's children bore a disproportionate share of that burden, facing acute food insecurity, destroyed healthcare infrastructure, and profound psychological trauma. Despite unprecedented access challenges, HCI maintained its principled, community-based approach and continued to deliver life-saving assistance through established humanitarian coordination systems.



WITNESSING THE CRISIS FIRSTHAND

In March 2025, during the ceasefire, HCI's Global Chief Programs Officer visited Gaza to witness firsthand the scale of the humanitarian catastrophe. The visit took place just before the ceasefire collapsed, plunging communities back into violence, displacement, and uncertainty.

During the visit, the delegation toured displacement shelters including HCI's first displacement site Hope Camp, which was later destroyed when hostilities resumed. They met with orphaned children and their families, visited field hospitals, and spoke directly with frontline responders serving their communities under extreme conditions. An unforgettable encounter was an iftar shared with young medical students, the future doctors of Gaza, whose resilience and determination remain unbroken despite the devastation surrounding them.

The delegation also visited the maternity field hospital in Al-Nuseirat established with UNFPA and MedGlobal and operated by Al-Awda Hospital, which is providing life-saving maternal care under extraordinarily difficult conditions. Meetings with international heads of mission from WHO, UNICEF, UNFPA, and UNRWA strengthened strategic partnerships and humanitarian coordination inside Gaza.

SUCCESS STORY:

A Father's Burden Lifted

One Family. One Intervention. One Restored Reason to Keep Going.

Forced from northern Gaza to the south with four children, this father arrived with nothing but grief. Two of his children battle skin cancer. One son is chronically ill. He is also guardian to an orphaned niece with her own health conditions, and sole support for his widowed sister. The war had taken his brothers, his uncles, his cousins. "There is no one left but a few of us," he said. They were living in a flimsy tent by the sea, battered by coastal winds and biting cold.

What was truly breaking him was not the cold. Every hour spent hunting for food, water, or firewood was an hour he could not spend being a father to children with cancer, to a child who had already lost his parents, to a family clinging to him as their only anchor.

When HCI's local partner team reached this family, they arrived with a comprehensive response built around what this family actually needed. Nutritious food boxes gave his cancer-stricken children the caloric foundation to withstand treatment. Safe bottled water and hygiene kits removed the daily terror of waterborne disease from a family already fighting illness. Warm blankets and weather-appropriate clothing meant children with compromised immune systems were no longer sleeping through fever-inducing cold. A weather-resistant tent gave them, for the first time in months, a protected space to rest and simply be a family.

"You have lifted a mountain from my shoulders. Now I can focus on being their rock, on comforting them, instead of only searching for scraps."

His fight is far from over. But today, this family is no longer teetering on the absolute brink. They have been seen. They have been heard. And because of the generosity behind HCI's work, a father has been given back the space to hold on to his humanity.





ZERO HUNGER: FOOD SECURITY PROGRAMS

Commitment to combat the global hunger crisis by addressing the root causes of food insecurity and malnutrition remains at the core of our work. We believe that hunger and malnutrition are preventable when communities are supported with timely, well-planned, and sustainable food assistance.

Specialized Food Assistance

Zakat al-Fitr:

Carefully planned and comprehensive Zakat al-Fitr eligible food packs were distributed at the end of Ramadan. These packs included rice, chickpeas, lentils, and other approved staple items, providing enough food to support a family for up to 15 days while fulfilling the religious obligation of Zakat al-Fitr.

Food Security in Yemen

In Yemen, 1,375 rights holders received life-saving food assistance through HCI's emergency response. For families living in one of the world's most complex conflict environments, a food parcel is not merely nutrition: it is survival. HCI's principled distribution approach ensured assistance reached the most vulnerable households, including female-headed families and those with disabled members.



SUCCESS STORY:

FROM PASSION TO PURPOSE



Lina's Story - Lebanon

Lina, a young Lebanese mother of three, had a passion for baking but faced impossible odds. With an unemployed husband and two children with autism, every day was a struggle. Opportunity felt out of reach.

When Lina enrolled in HCI's confectionery and baking training program, something shifted. For 12 months, food assistance from HCI meant her family's basic needs were met, freeing her mind to learn. She mastered cakes, cupcakes, and traditional sweets including Maamoul and Ma'akaron, alongside essential food safety practices.

Upon completing the training, Lina received start-up equipment including an oven and baking utensils. She began taking orders from home, staying close to her children. Her work caught the attention of her husband's family, who offered her a position at their patisserie. Today, Lina earns between \$450 and \$500 per month, especially during festive seasons.

But the impact goes far beyond income. The psychological relief of financial stability, the pride of mastery, and the restoration of purpose transformed Lina from someone surviving each day to someone building a future. She is present for her children not just physically, but emotionally, because the daily terror of poverty has been replaced by the quiet dignity of self-reliance.

"I hope one day I can start running my own business."

Lina's story is HCI's mission in action: food assistance that does not just fill a stomach, but restores dignity, reduces psychological stress, and empowers a mother to build the independent, hopeful future her family deserves.

WASH: WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE



WATER IS LIFE

Through our Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) programs, our mission is to implement sustainable WASH initiatives that empower communities to become self-sufficient. By expanding reliable access to safe, clean water through community water wells, large-scale water stations, and emergency water distribution, HCI strengthens progress toward SDG 6 of universal, affordable, and sustainably managed safe, clean water access.

In 2025, HCI implemented WASH interventions across Bangladesh, India, Kenya, Pakistan, Somalia, Yemen, and the Gaza Strip. Compared to the previous year, our WASH programs served **approximately 367% more people**, a nearly fivefold scale-up driven by increased responsiveness to the lifesaving need for clean water in developing and crisis contexts.



GAZA: EMERGENCY WATER RESPONSE

Amidst the catastrophic humanitarian crisis in Gaza, HCI distributed approximately 5 million litres of safe, clean water, reaching almost 400,000 internally displaced people living in camps across the Gaza Strip. HCI also partnered with the Al-Maghazi Municipality to repair and rehabilitate the main water desalination plant. The fully rehabilitated and operational desalination plant now provides safe drinking water to more than 35,000 residents, reducing the risk of waterborne diseases and improving public health.



YEMEN: SOLAR POWERED WATER INFRASTRUCTURE

HCI installed a 130-metre-deep, solar-powered water well and water station, ensuring safe, clean water for 34,000 people. The water station, powered by renewable energy, includes two water points each equipped with a 4,000-litre water tank and a control room ensuring real-time monitoring and maintenance. We also held hygiene awareness activities for children and families providing education on personal hygiene, cholera prevention, measles awareness, and the importance of immunization.



COMMUNITY WELLS ACROSS ASIA AND AFRICA

In Bangladesh, India, Pakistan, Kenya, and Somalia, HCI constructed 274 water wells in communities, expanding access to safe, clean, reliable drinking water for vulnerable households.

SUCCESS STORY: SOLAR WELLS TRANSFORM SCHOOLS IN PAKISTAN



One of HCI's water well projects in Pakistan focused on constructing 50 solar-powered wells in schools. One of the schools in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Pakistan serves 893 students including 40 orphans. For years the school relied on a seasonal hand pump that dried up in summer, with water quality tests revealing pathogen contamination.

HCI funded a solar-powered borewell drilled to 120 feet, with a solar panel and storage tank ensuring continuous safe water during school hours. This now directly benefits 902 individuals daily, boosting attendance and improving sanitation for children and the surrounding community.

Improved safe, clean water access reduces the burden on women and girls, decreasing time spent collecting water and enhancing safety, dignity, and opportunities for education and livelihoods.

Poverty and financial hardship remain the primary barriers to children's access to basic needs such as food, education, clean water, and healthcare. Our Child Sponsorship Program (CSP) responds to this reality by providing comprehensive, life-changing support that addresses children's educational, physical, emotional, and psychological needs. The CSP aligns with SDG 4 (Quality Education), aiming to ensure inclusive, equitable, and quality learning opportunities for every child.

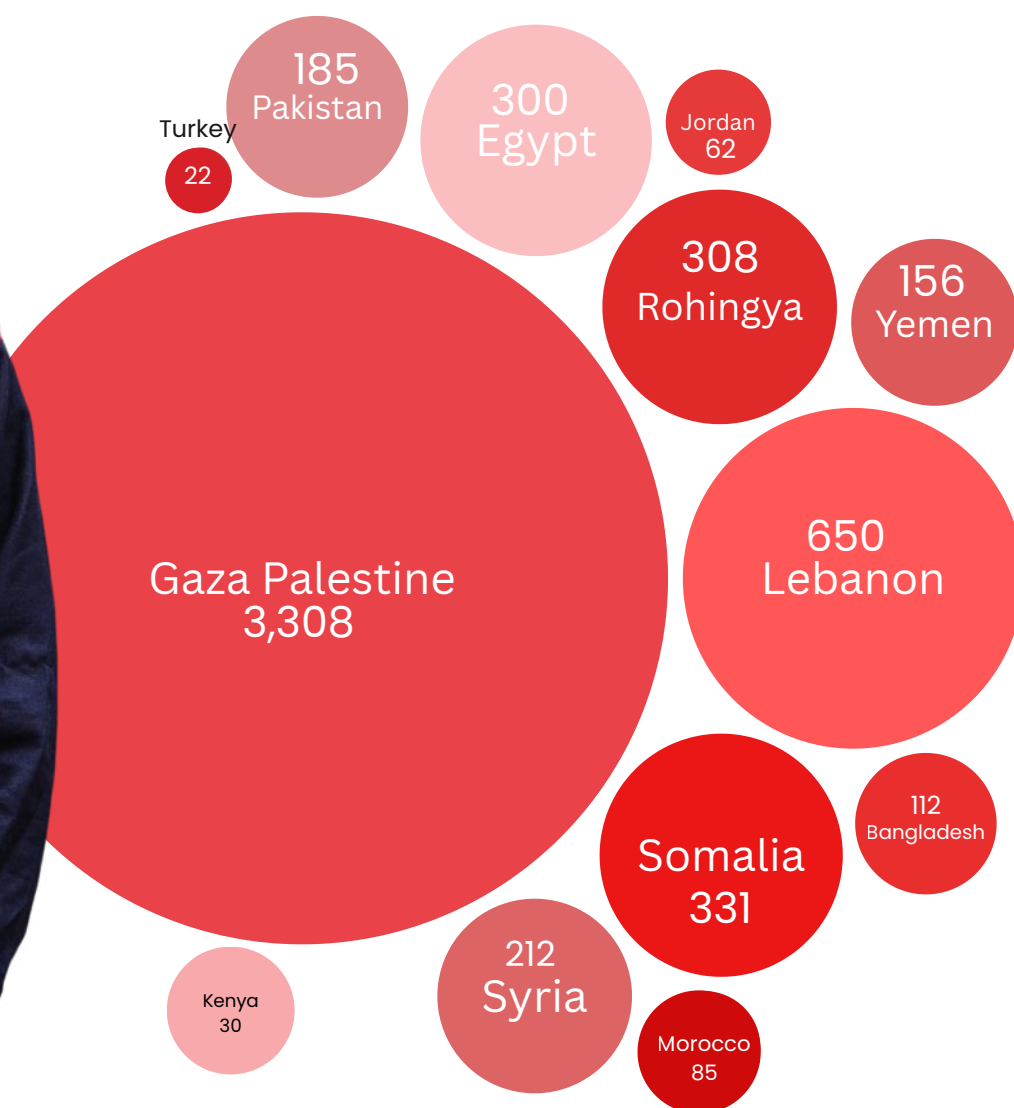

COUNTRIES OF IMPLEMENTATION IN 2025

In response to growing humanitarian emergencies, HCI expanded the CSP in 2025 to four new contexts: **Gaza, Jordan, Kenya, and Egypt**, focusing on orphans and children living in highly vulnerable conditions.

Moreover, the CSP was implemented across Bangladesh, including Rohingya communities, Pakistan, Turkey (Uyghur children), Lebanon, Syria, Yemen, Somalia.



SUCCESS STORY:

The Wall Was Her Paper



Zeina is ten years old.

Before the war, she used to draw with her father. Now he is gone, killed in the conflict, leaving her mother, Naeifa, to raise six children alone. Their apartment is little more than a shell. The walls are burned, the kitchen is gone, and there is no furniture. With no paper left, Zeina draws on the blackened walls instead.

When HCI reached the family, it provided food, hygiene supplies, and safe spaces where the children could play and begin to feel like children again.

Then came a shopping trip.

For the first time in months, the children were not asked what they needed to survive. They were asked what they wanted.

Zeina chose pencils, while her siblings opted for clothes & shoes. She held them carefully, as though she had found something she thought was lost forever.

Your support did more than meet this family's immediate needs. It gave a child the chance to dream, create, and be a child again.



EDUCATION PROGRAM

OPENING DOORS TO LEARNING

Human Concern International's Education Program aims to ensure equitable access to quality, inclusive, and sustainable education for vulnerable children and youth affected by poverty, displacement, disability, and conflict. Through strategic partnerships, targeted scholarships, school infrastructure development, teacher capacity building, and holistic learning environments, HCI works to empower learners, strengthen communities, and foster long-term socio-economic resilience. In 2025, HCI implemented projects across **Palestine (Gaza), Pakistan, Syria, Yemen, Jordan, Egypt, and Turkey.**

SUCCESS STORY: EXCELLENCE BEYOND LIMITS



In rural Sindh, Pakistan, HCI's support for deaf students produced extraordinary results in 2025. Two deaf students from Rashidabad secured 1st and 2nd positions among 1,977 candidates from mainstream hearing schools, an unprecedented achievement that highlights what is possible when inclusive education is adequately supported.

In total, all 25 deaf students who appeared in the Government Board examinations achieved A or A+ grades, resulting in a 100 percent pass rate.

Aqsa secured the top position in the Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education Hyderabad examinations, competing with students from nine districts. Alongside her academic excellence, she is also a gifted artist.

Zareen achieved second position despite significant economic and social challenges. She comes from a low-income family with her father working as a salesman and her mother also hard of hearing. Her success in both academics and Fine Arts stands as a powerful testament to resilience and serves as an inspiration for other girls facing similar barriers.

HEALTH PROGRAM

RESTORING HEALTH, RESTORING HOPE

In 2025, Human Concern International continued its commitment to strengthening healthcare access for vulnerable populations across Gaza, Syria, Bosnia, Egypt, and Turkey. Through 7 targeted health projects, HCI reached over 111,000 individuals, providing essential medical services, psychosocial support, and community health interventions in crisis-affected areas.

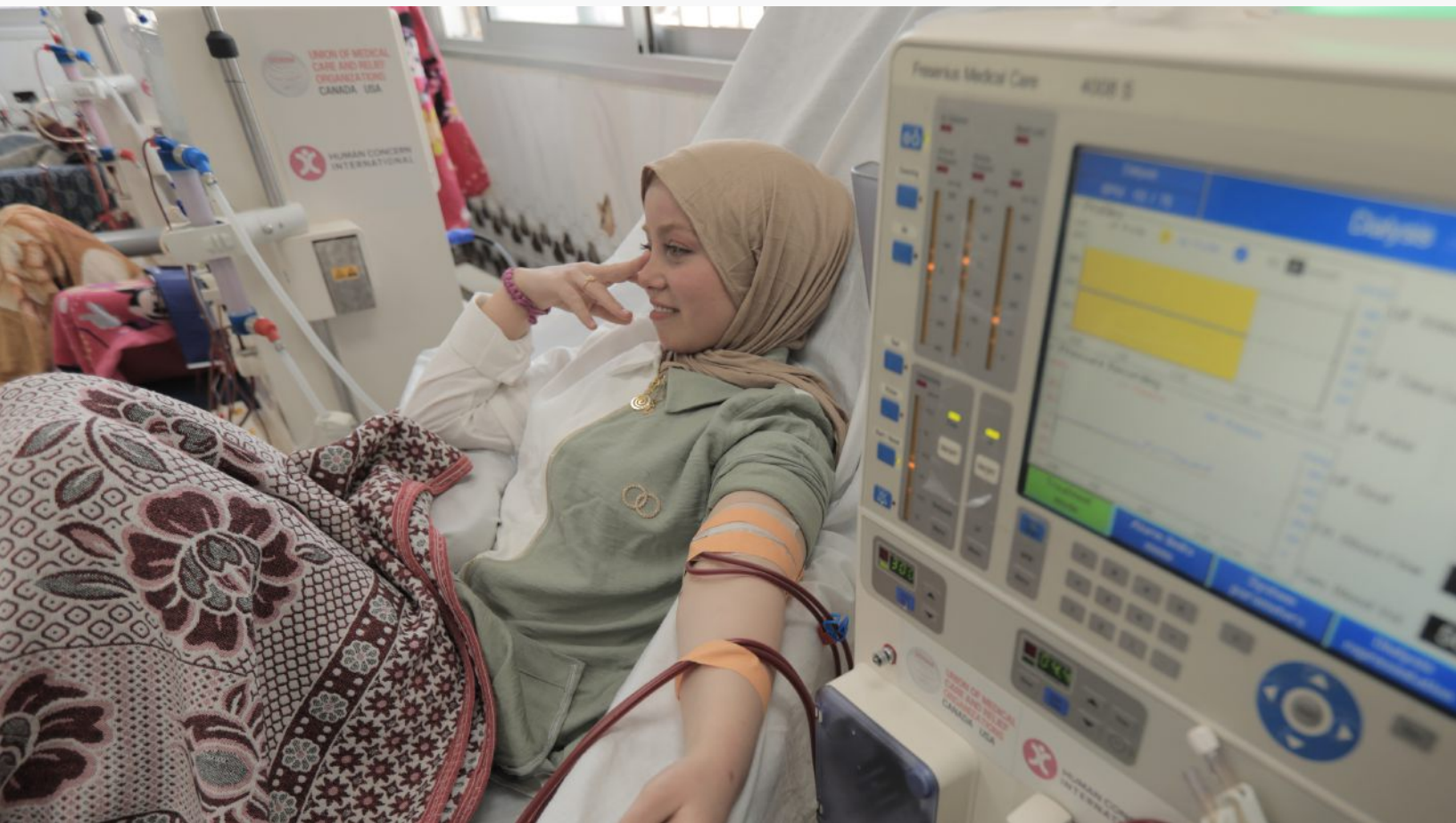

GAZA: COMPREHENSIVE HEALTHCARE RESPONSE

HCI's health response in Gaza in 2025 was extensive and life-saving. Across maternal health, surgical care, dialysis treatment, and community health services, HCI's projects collectively reached tens of thousands of patients in some of the most difficult conditions imaginable. The Field Maternity Hospital alone served **55,797** women. **Eleven** dialysis units procured by HCI are now operational at **three** Gaza hospitals, sustaining life-saving treatment for patients with end-stage renal disease.



International Health Programs:

Syria, Bosnia, Egypt and Turkey

Beyond Gaza, HCI's health programs reached over **39,000** patients through the Al-Zahrawi Health Center in Syria, providing general, women's health, pediatric, dental, and pharmacy services.

In Bosnia, **165** elderly individuals received home care, health monitoring, psychosocial support, and essential aid through **5,523** home visits.

In Egypt and Turkey, more than **2,227** Gaza evacuees received medical care, housing, financial assistance, and education support.



SUCCESS STORY: HEALING THROUGH CARE



Abdal Rahman's Recovery Journey - Gaza

In Gaza, even preparing a simple meal has become dangerous. With cooking gas nearly impossible to find, families are forced to rely on unsafe methods – burning fuel, wood, and open flames just to survive another day. For children, these conditions can turn ordinary moments into life-changing tragedies.

Abdal Rahman was only trying to help his mother.

As she struggled to keep up with the endless responsibilities of daily life in crisis, Abdal stepped into the kitchen to assist with the cooking. But the fire they were forced to use was unsafe. In an instant, the flames severely burned his leg, leaving him in immense pain and his family terrified for his future.

For a child already growing up amid hardship and instability, the injury was devastating. Severe burns are not only physically painful, they can lead to dangerous infections, long-term complications, and emotional trauma, especially in places where access to medical care is limited.

But Abdal's story did not end there.

Through the lifesaving partnership between HCI and MedGlobal, Abdal received urgent burn treatment and continuous medical care when he needed it most. HCI's support ensured that his wounds were cleaned, treated, and carefully monitored through regular dressing changes and follow-up care, services that many families in Gaza simply cannot access on their own.

What could have become a lifelong tragedy instead became a story of healing, dignity, and hope.

Today, Abdal is recovering. His wounds are healing, his pain is easing, and his family no longer faces this crisis alone. With quiet gratitude, Abdal thanks HCI for caring for him and changing the dressings on his injured leg throughout his recovery.

In a place where even cooking a meal can put a child's life at risk, HCI's medical support is doing far more than treating injuries; it is restoring hope to families who have nowhere else to turn.

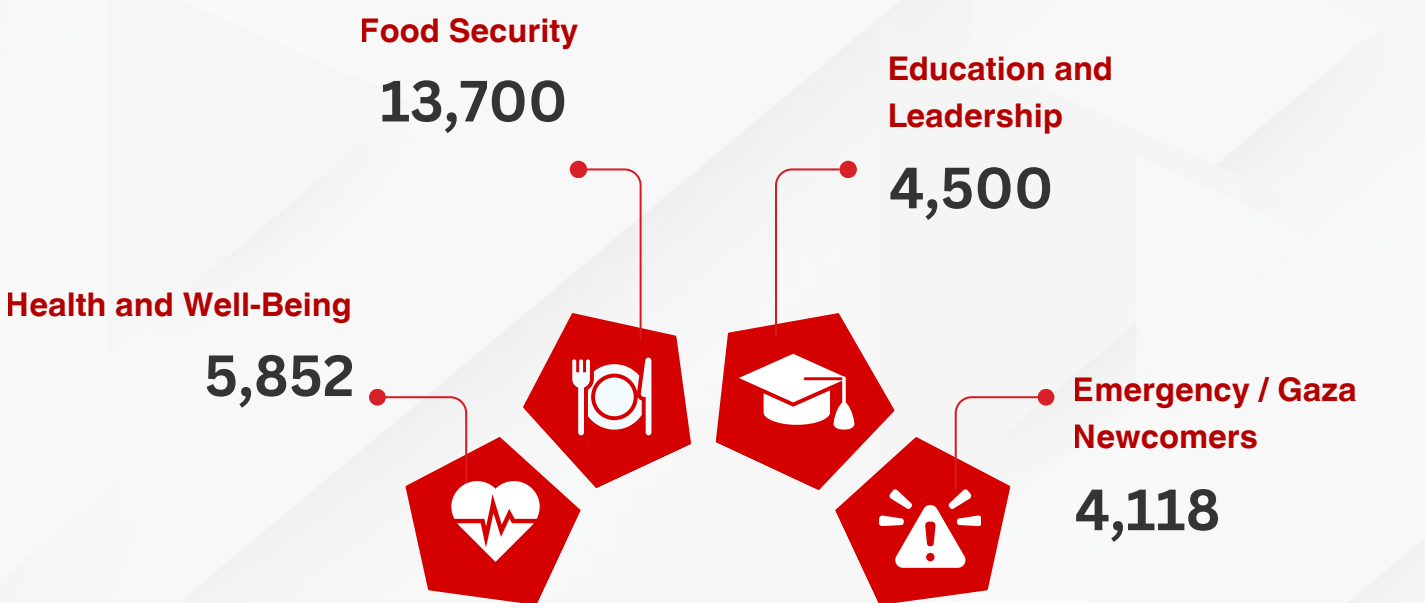
LOCAL PROGRAMS: CANADA

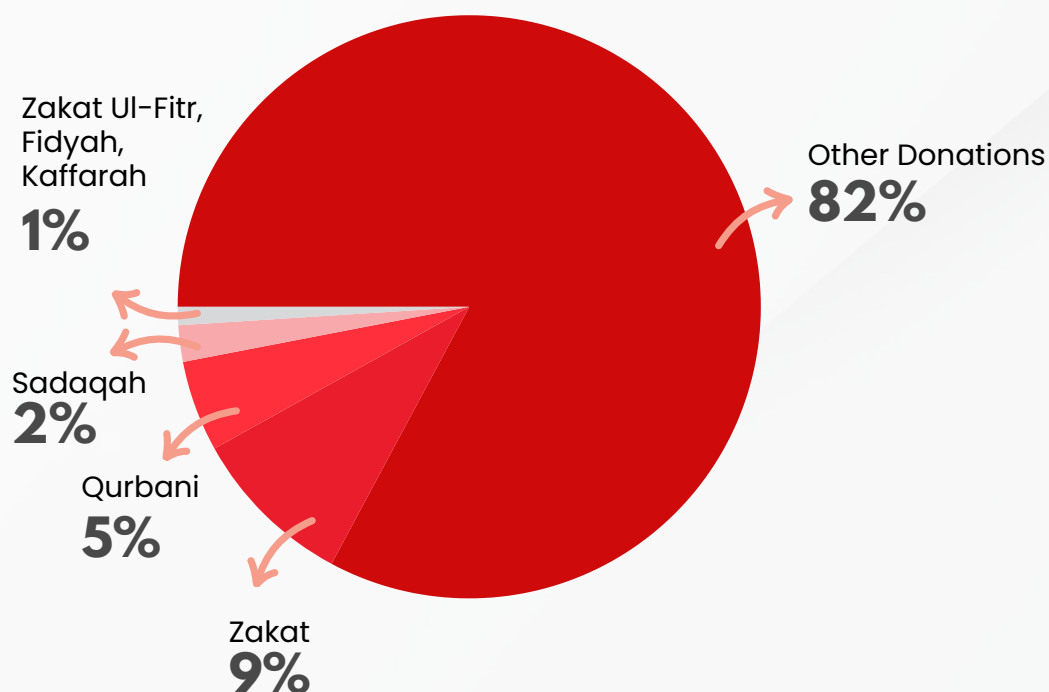

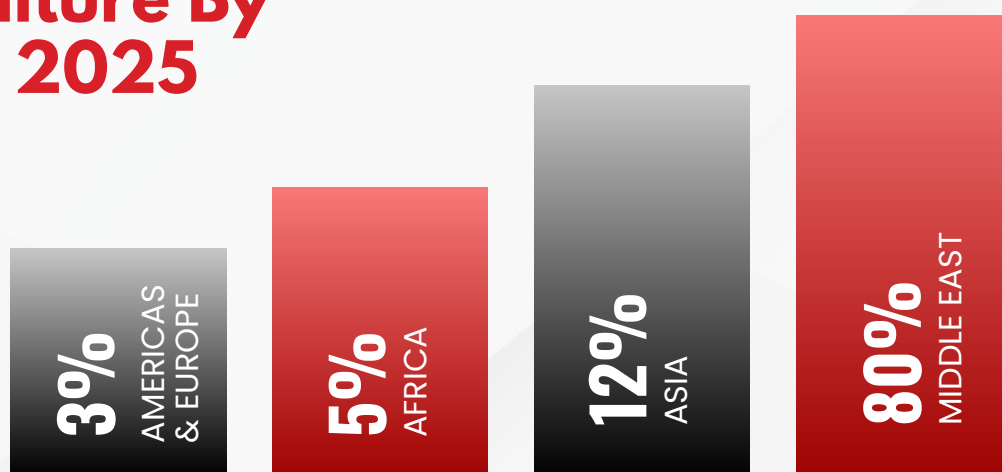
